The Story

In the gospel story this week, Jesus describes himself as the one true vine.

We are the branches connected to the vine and we bear fruit in our lives as long as we are connected to Jesus.

God is the gardener, the one who trims and protects the vine.

Jesus tells his disciples to stay connected to him, because without Jesus they can do nothing. When we stay joined to Jesus, we can be patient, kind, generous, loving and joyful.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

15:1-5, 7-8

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts away every branch of mine that doesn't produce fruit. But he trims clean every branch that does produce fruit, so that it will produce even more fruit.

"You are already clean because of what I have said to you.

"Stay joined to me, and I will stay joined to you. Just as a branch cannot produce fruit unless it stays joined to the vine, you cannot produce fruit unless you stay joined to me.

"I am the vine, and you are the branches. If you stay joined to me, and I stay joined to you, then you will produce lots of fruit. But you cannot do anything without me.

"Stay joined to me and let my teachings become part of you. Then you can pray for whatever you want, and your prayer will be answered.

"When you become fruitful disciples of mine, my Father will be honoured."

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Group Discussion

You will need: printed activity for each child (see below), coloured markers, coloured pencils or paints, glitter glue.


- 1) Colour the image of the vine, branches and fruit.
