Something to Think About

Can you remember the last time there was a storm? Imagine if you were on a boat in the middle of a lake in the middle of a storm. Imagine what it would be like to feel the wind blowing and the waves crashing against the boat.

The Story

Today's gospel is a great rescue story! The disciples were caught in a storm and Jesus saved them. Jesus told the wind and the waves to be still and they obeyed immediately. Jesus wondered why the disciples had been so afraid and he told them to have faith.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark

4:35-41

Jesus said to his disciples, "Let's cross to the east side.

"So they left the crowd, and his disciples started across the lake with him in the boat.

Some other boats followed along. Suddenly a windstorm struck the lake. Waves started splashing into the boat, and it was about to sink.

Jesus was in the back of the boat with his head on a pillow, and he was asleep. His disciples woke him and said, "Teacher, don't you care that we're about to drown?"

Jesus got up and ordered the wind and the waves to be quiet. The wind stopped, and everything was calm.

Jesus asked his disciples, "Why were you afraid? Don't you have any faith?"

Now they were more afraid than ever and said to each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

Group Activity

JESUS CALMS THE STORM

You will need: boat template for each child, A4 paper, blue construction paper pre-cut for the waves, paddle-pop sticks, crayons or coloured pencils.

Colour the printable of Jesus and the disciples in the boat.

Stick the boat at the end of a paddle-pop stick.


Glue the waves onto the sheet of paper, applying the glue only at the outer two edges.


Slide the paddle-pop stick boat underneath the waves so the boat can move across the water.


Children may like to add storm clouds and lightning in the sky!














We can meet Jesus when we are quiet.
