THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD 12/01/2025

Dear Parishioners,

At this Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. It is the great event because it is the occasion of the first public revelation of all the Three Persons in the **Holy Trinity**, and the official revelation of **Jesus as the Son of God** to the world by God the Father. Hence, it is described by all four Gospels. This celebration presents Jesus being baptized by John in the Jordan River. The celebration marks the end of the Christmas Season and the beginning of Ordinary Time.

Jesus baptism by John was a very important event in the Messianic mission. First it was a **moment of identification with us sinners**. Sinless, Jesus received the baptism of repentance to identify Himself with His people who realized for the first time that they were sinners. Second, it was a **moment of conviction about Jesus' identity and mission**: that He is the Son of God and His mission was to preach the Good News of God's love and salvation and to atone for our sins by becoming the "*suffering servant*".

God the Father's words, "*This is My beloved Son*," confirmed Jesus' Identity as Incarnate Son of God, and the words "*with Whom I am well pleased*," pointed to Jesus' mission of atoning for the sins of the world by suffering and dying on the cross. **Third, it was moment of equipment. The Holy Spirit, descending and resting upon Jesus in the form of a dove, bestowed on Jesus the power to preach and heal.**

The baptism of Jesus reminds us of our identity. It reminds us of who we are and whose we are. By Baptism we become sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, members of his Church, heirs of Heaven, and temples of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' baptism reminds us also of our mission to experience the presence of God within us, to acknowledge our own dignity as God's children, and to appreciate the Divine Presence in others by honouring them, loving them and serving them in all humility.

It is a day to thank God for the graces we have received in Baptism, to renew our Baptismal promises and to preach Christ's "Good News" by our transparent Christian lives of love, mercy, service and forgiveness.
