SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME 19/01/2025

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the second Sunday of the ordinary season of the year. Today's readings tell us about the true identity of Jesus, who he is, and what his mission is. We need to know who Jesus is and understand his mission if we want to be his true disciples. We respond to God's love through lives that encourage forgiveness and reconciliation.

The Gospel presents to us the first miracle performed by Jesus at a wedding. A wedding is a time of abundance and celebration. From the food and wine that are served to the music and dancing that follow, weddings overflow with the goodness of life. At a deeper level, weddings speak about love, compassion, and unity. Wedding feast at Cana is a sign of God's love and compassion.

The first reading gives us the celebration of Joy over the restoration of the relationship between God and his people. Years of exile had made people realize their foolishness and now they consider it a privilege to serve the Lord God. God comes to them as a special gift. God had remained silent for a long period of time because of the sins of His disobedient children. Now the people will be obedient and trustful to God who is their saviour.

In the second reading of today, Paul enumerates the gifts the Christian Community has received. These gifts are a gratuitous present that has come to each from the almighty. Paul says that diverse though these gifts are, they all come from the one God. We are called upon to use them to complement one another, for the good of others, for building up God's Kingdom on earth.

The action of Jesus turning water into wine is the first of the seven signs that Jesus performed and recorded in the Gospel of John. On the surface, signs appear to be miracles but John presents them with a particular purpose. These miracles have a strong symbolic significance that tells us about Jesus and also his messianic work. Each miracle reveals the messianic sign of Jesus the Messiah who is the full revelation of God to us. He is a

word that has become flesh for the sake of humanity.
